

Frontline Gynaecology

Frontline Gynaecology is a one-day training course of seven hours duration which has been developed by Rural Health West in conjunction with specialists from the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at the Women's and Children's Health Service in Perth.

Presented by senior medical staff with extensive gynaecological experience with a high trainer to participant ratio, it is a good mix of case-based learning and practical skills workshops relating to common and acute gynaecological problems.

The Frontline Gynaecology course attracts the Procedural Training Grant.

Objectives

On completion of the Frontline Gynaecology course registrants should be able to:

- Assess and manage abnormal bleeding
- Assess and manage women who present with pelvic pain
- Assess by history and examination women who present with vulval irritation
- Explain the new pap smear guidelines including the new categorisation of results and the appropriate management of abnormal results
- Explain the circumstances under which thin-prep and HPV testing are appropriate
- Manage requests for contraception, including risk assessment, counselling and follow up
- Insert a Mirena IUD
- Assess and manage early-pregnancy complications, bleeding, miscarriage, ectopic pregnancy and rhesus negative women with bleeding
